A vanishing edge pool makes the most of an ocean-side location in British Columbia

Overlooking Semiahmoo Bay just south of Vancouver, British Columbia, is the beautiful ocean-side residential community of White Rock, where a magnificent pool and spa was designed for a family who wanted a spectacular focal point for outdoor entertaining.

Built by Aloha Pools Ltd. of Burnaby, British Columbia, the boot-shaped inground concrete pool features a vanishing edge design that makes the water in the pool appear to be continuing on into the endless blue sky. A concrete ledge was also installed in the pool near the vanishing edge, allowing bathers to

stand in the deep end and take in the breathtaking view of the ocean down below.

The rectangular portion of the pool measures 5.7 m x 12.1 m (19 ft. x 40 ft.), with a depth ranging from 1 m (3 ft. 6 in.) at the shallow end to 1.8 m (6 ft.) at the deep end, while the rounded section of the 'boot' measures 5.4 m x 7.6 (18 ft. x 25 ft.), with a depth ranging from 0.6 m to 1 m (2 ft. to 3 ft. 6 in.).

The interior of the pool is finished with white plaster, along with cobalt blue dolphin-themed mosaics and waterline tiles and natural grey concrete coping, while the spa is finished with white mosaic tiles, accented by cobalt blue tiles at the waterline.

The beautifully landscaped property surrounding the pool and spa gradually slopes down toward the ocean and features a large ceramic tile deck area, artificial rock stream, a large Koi pond, gazebo, flower gardens, native plants and trees.
